Annual Progress Report Agency Accomplishments for the Fiscal Year

Notable Achievements for 2018 - 2019

- Developed a total of 25 new off-site habilitation crew contracts and 70 new grounds maintenance crew contracts throughout the community within existing business partnerships and through the establishment of new partnerships with other prominent, local businesses, as well as private residences on the grounds maintenance side;
- Developed fully-integrated, individual, community-based employment positions for nine additional consumers within seven local businesses;
- Held the seventh annual "Viva La Fiesta" Baja Bash Fundraiser at a beautiful, new venue, Hacienda Reyes in Palmdale, and raised in excess of \$100,000 to support agency operations;
- Purchased and installed 12 new computers for the Project Independence computer lab thanks to a \$10,000 grant from the QH Knights of Columbus' Columbian Foundation;
- Developed six volunteer sites at which consumers may donate their time to help others in need: S.A.V.E.S. Food Bank in Palmdale, Rancho Village Retirement Community in Palmdale, AV Hospital Thrift Store, Valley Oasis Thrift Store in Palmdale, Hope of the Valley Thrift Store in Canyon Country, and Love This Horse Equine Rescue in Acton;
- Secured a brand new bus that can accommodate up to four wheelchairs to assist consumers to access community-based work training sites associated with the Work Readiness Program; and
- Completed and submitted to North Los Angeles County Regional Center a plan for expansion of the Work Readiness Program into the Santa Clarita Valley.

Looking Ahead to 2019-20 Organizational Strategic Plan

- Secure vendorization for the Work Readiness Program at a 1:4 ratio in the Santa Clarita Valley and seek to develop additional programs in that area;
- Continue to expand volunteerism and paid work opportunities within the AV-base Work Readiness Program broadening vocational categories beyond the more typical janitorial, grounds maintenance, and food service- type opportunities;
- Expand the volunteerism component within the Project Independence Program;
- Explore a partnership with the AV Union High School District for food service training for special ed students in Desert Haven's cafeteria;

- Complete program design and vendorization of the Paid Internship Program, as well as the Competitive Integrated Employment Incentives Payment Program;
- Develop no less than ten community-based individual placement employment positions;
- Coordinate with the AV Air Quality Management District in testing green grounds maintenance equipment to determine feasibility for use on contracts;
- Seek to establish a minimum wage component of the Work Readiness Program in the Antelope Valley; and
- Continue to push for rate reform through the CA State Legislature and monitor changes on Fed level.



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
